History Trivia

- ◇ The now familiar procession of crèche figures at the beginning of Advent worship began in December 1987.
- ◇ The nativity set was given by Darleen Raabe's intermediate Sunday School class in 1974. Darleen bought the greenware, three students in the class cleaned it, then Darleen had it fired. The children painted it and it was fired the second time. *(I think this is about the large colorful nativity set that was in the narthex in Advent 2011)*
- ◇ In June 1988 there was an Anniversary Dinner party honoring Pastor Clark for 25 years of ordained ministry and Pastor Varner for 45 years of ordained ministry. The 183 guests who attended enjoyed a magician, a dance band, and Larry Otte as MC. Larry Otte also "roasted" Pastor Clark with one funny story after another. Pastor Morrod was also honored for his 35 years in ordained ministry.
- ◇ In 1988, the congregation was busy considering plans to enlarge the church building. The addition of the classroom wing and the renovation of Luther Hall was completed in 1988, and work began on the sanctuary and office building soon afterwards.
- ◇ Even with these building projects, the council took a vacation for the months of June, July, and August, with the provision to call special meetings as needed.
- ◇ The first adventure of the Pairs-n-Spares Travelers was to view the Lipizzaner Stallions perform. The next event was a three-night cruise leaving from St. Petersburg. Then there was a shopping trip to an outlet mall. In 1990 some of the folks went to Germany for the Oberammergau Passion Play.
- ◇ In 1989 the third annual country fair raised over \$4000, which was used to put a kitchenette in the new "family room," which we now call the parlor.
